

Gut Diagnosis Cyrex Array 4 and 10 Action Steps

- 1. Set up a free consult with Cyrex Laboratories to interpret one of your patient's Cyrex Array 4 or 10 test results.
- 2. Practice explaining to a patient or a partner the concept of food cross-reactivity.
- 3. Maltodextrin is used as a thickener, filler, or preservative in many processed foods. It is an artificially produced white powder that can be enzymatically derived from any starch, most commonly made from corn, rice, potato starch, or wheat. Discuss this information with a patient who might benefit from avoiding this food additive and may not be aware of this hidden ingredient.

Discuss answers to the following questions about Cyrex Array 4 and 10 with your partner/small group.

- 1. Will positive results always be positive?
- 2. Are equivocal results positive?
- 3. Should positive results be confirmed with elimination/provocation?
- 4. If reintroduction of positive food doesn't cause symptoms, is it safe?

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
